

The following exercises are included in the current mother tongue textbook for 6th grade: Exercise 37 Read the text. Determine the purpose of the text. Describe your thoughts on nature conservation.

Kochimov) In this case, the teacher teaches the exercise and says that they will show you what you need to do to save nature by drawing. Students draw with coloured pencils about what needs to be done to save nature, and create a text of the story based on the drawings. We can see the steps in this diagram below.

Step 1: Reading an exercise;

Step 2: Draw a picture;

Step 3: Set out your ideas:

The following exercise is given in the same textbook: Exercise 41. Read a poem about winter. Describe the scene and write a prose text, paying attention to the connection between the sentences.

The evening sky is soft

Snow is starting to snow.

Towards the black hair of the night

He starts to pale (Dilshod Rajab).

Students read a poem and draw winter. When a scene in their imagination is reflected on paper, an association of words associated with the scene is formed in their minds and speech is realised through picture-

based images. By integrating the pen and thinking, a diversity of speech is achieved. Under the conditions of the exercise, a descriptive text in prose is created.

Since the next exercise is linked to the topic of the discussion text, it is recommended that some changes be made to the terms of the exercise. Initially, the teacher says that the textbook should be closed and asks students to take a pen. The word "Dragonfly" is written on the blackboard and pupils are asked to draw this insect. While drawing the dragonfly, pupils begin to have a basic system of information about the dragonfly in their mind: colour, structure, food, size, etc. Dragonflies. When students draw a dragonfly, they are asked what they know about the animal. During the survey, students are given the opportunity to discuss (if the class is divided into groups, the opportunity to consult). After listening to the ideas, exercise 48 in the textbook is performed. Exercise 48 Read the text, paying attention to the content and grammatical relationship of the sentences.

Do you know which animal in the world eats the most food? You probably think you are a lion or a tiger. Others think it is a bear or a wolf. Some even include elephants. But none of this is true. If one dragonfly kills so many pests, you can imagine how many tens or hundreds of dragonflies would benefit nature and people. In this way, the dragonfly acts as a guardian of nature. Based on this exercise, ideas about the dragonfly are generalized, and students who draw a beautiful picture of the dragonfly are encouraged.

CONCLUSIONS

The above-mentioned exercises, which are carried out in connection with the science of fine arts, develop memory and help you fully understand the subject as well as feel the diversity of the world. German art historian Johann Joachim Winkelmann wrote that painting was an important tool for contemplation: in mother tongue lessons, the science of fine arts thus occupies a special place in the schoolchildren's world view, thinking, perception of being and the appeal of speech. Although today's education system requires an integrated approach to the learning process, this approach will undoubtedly work.

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
